

InternShop meets students where they are, allowing them to apply for internships either where they live or where they attend a SUNY campus.

All students can apply, regardless of the type of credential they are pursuing.

• Exclusive access to NEW internships in every field for the Spring 2016 semester;

- Guaranteed worksite supervision and corporate compensation of at least minimum wage;
- Adequate workspace, oversight, assignments, and a safe work environment;
- Formal documentation of work;
- An interview for full employment following the placement.

How it works

- 1. Students apply online through suny.edu/internshop.
- 2. Students answer a few questions about campus, home location, program of study, and special interests; they are also able to include a personal statement defining their academic and career goals. InternShop is not just a repository of opportunities, but a cutting-edge matching tool. Based on student input, InternShop matches students with relevant, meaningful internship opportunities nearby.
- 3. After applying, students are immediately alerted to next steps. They will receive information about pursuing these paid internships for academic credit. Every time a student is matched to a new opportunity, they are alerted by the tool.
