**Make It!** highlights the artistic talents of the faculty and staff at Farmingdale State College. This exhibit offers a glimpse into the creative personal endeavors or professional work of this cadre of people who share the common ground known as Farmingdale State College. Celebrating the collective creativity of the staff through an exhibit not centralized around a specific theme, but instead focused on recent works allows the college community to come together through art-making and studio practice.

The interpretation of subject matter is diverse in material and concept, bringing the viewer on a journey from the familiar through fantasy. Landscapes are explored as picturesque destinations, and abstract interpretations. The figure is presented as an artistic illusion of form, and as a portrait of likeness. Commercial graphic design is presented as visual communication and design and also presented as voice of activism.
