THE SCHOLARSHIP

How can you help make Long Island safer for pedestrians and foot traffic?

Walk Safe Long Island will award scholarships to two students who submit an educational video to the Pedestrian Education Video Scholarship Competition.

**First place will receive \$2,000;
Second place will receive \$1,000.**



INSTRUCTIONS

- **Create a short video** that illustrates one or more of the Vehicle and Traffic Laws for Pedestrian Enforcement as detailed by the New York State Department of Transportation
- **Answer the question,** “Why is it important to educate Long Islanders about pedestrian and traffic safety?” (Please answer the question in the space provided within the submission form.)
- **Submit your video** and answer at walksafeli.org/video **by August 31st, 2019**

CRITERIA

Walk Safe Long Island’s Pedestrian Education Video Scholarship Competition is open to high school juniors and seniors, and college freshman and sophomores, who are Long Island residents, and who submit a video adhering to the **following**;

Video no less than 30 seconds, no longer than 3 minutes

Content should focus on highlighting one or more of the Vehicle and Traffic Laws for Pedestrian Enforcement. You can reference those laws on our website.

Video cannot contain profanity, lude or inappropriate content, or personal information

Submission of video, regardless of selection for award, gives the New York Coalition for Transportation Safety (award-granting entity) permission to use and repurpose content for educational and promotional purposes related to video’s original content.

DEADLINE: Videos must be submitted no later than Saturday, August 31st, 2019.

Winners will be notified during the first week of September 2019. Awardees must be present for an award ceremony on Monday, September 16th, at 4 p.m.
